

Course Description: British Literature will introduce you to the works of major British writers from the Anglo-Saxon period, the Middle Ages, the Renaissance, the Restoration, the Romantic Period, and some contemporary works. One of the major contributions this course imparts is a comprehensive examination of the writing genius found in the works of these British giants

whose worth and content still stands firmly even now. As such, you will be asked to apply the timeless lessons these writers offer to the culture in which we live today. Additionally, surrounding these works in their historical context will foster a deeper understanding of the human condition. Composition in all genres is a major component of

this course, as well as development of analytical and critical thinking skills. Grammar, mechanics and usage will be covered mostly within the context of the literature and writings assigned throughout the year.
